### TOWNSHIP OF LUCAN BIDDULPH

#### **BY-LAW NUMBER 24-2017**

### BEING A BY-LAW TO CONTROL NOISE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LUCAN BIDDULPH

WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, Chapter 25, Section 129 (1) provides that by-laws may be passed by the Councils of local municipalities for prohibiting or regulating noise and vibration within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and necessary to provide an environment free from unusual, unnecessary or excessive noises or vibrations which may disturb the inhabitants of the Township of Lucan Biddulph;

THEREFORE the Council of the Township of Lucan Biddulph enacts as follows:

#### 1. **DEFINITIONS**

"Business Areas" means those areas within the municipality zoned under the Zoning By-law as follows:

- Central Commercial, Highway Commercial or Farm Commercial (C1; C2; C3) Zones;
- General Industrial, Farm Industrial or Extractive Industrial (M1; M2, M3) zones;
- Institutional (I) Zone;
- Public Utility (U) Zone

"Construction" includes erection, alteration, repair, dismantling, demolition, structural maintenance, painting, moving, land clearing, earth moving, grading, excavating, the laying of pipe and conduit whether above or below ground level, street and highway building, concreting, equipment installation and alteration and the structural installation of construction components and materials in any form or for any purpose, and includes any work in connection therewith;

"Construction equipment" means any equipment or device designed and intended for use in construction or material handling, including but not limited to air compressors, pile drivers, pneumatics or hydraulic tools, bulldozers, tractors, excavators, trenchers, cranes, derricks, loaders, scrapers, pavers, generators, off-highway haulers or trucks, ditchers, compactors and rollers, pumps, concrete mixers, graders, or other material handling equipment;

"Conveyance" includes a vehicle and any other device employed to transport a person or persons or goods from place to place but does not include any such device or vehicle if operated within the premises of a person;

"Council" means the Council of the Township of Lucan Biddulph;

"Highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle designed and intended for, or used by, the general public for the passage of vehicles;

"Motor vehicles" includes an automobile, motorcycle, and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power;

"Motorized conveyances" means a conveyance propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular, gravitational or wind power;

"Municipality" means the Township of Lucan Biddulph;

"Noise" means unwanted sound;

#### "Officer" means:

- i) any police officer,
- ii) a By-law Enforcement Officer, Building Inspector or Chief Building Official as appointed by the Council of the Municipality;

"Point of Reception" means any point where sound or vibration originating from a location other than that point is received;

"Residential Areas" means those areas within the municipality zoned under the Zoning By-law as follows:

- Residential First, Second or Third Density (R1; R2; R3) Zones;
- Mixed Use Residential (MUR) Zones;
- Hamlet Residential (HR) Zone;
- Future Residential (FR) Zone;
- Open Space (OS) Zones within Settlement Areas;

"Rural Areas" means those areas within the municipality zoned under the Zoning By-law as follows:

- Agricultural (A1, A2, A3) Zones;
- Surplus Dwelling (SD) Zone;
- Rural Residential (RR) Zone;
- Open Space (OS) Zones outside of Settlement Areas;

"Settlement Areas" means those areas of the municipality located within settlement areas as identified in the Lucan Biddulph Official Plan;

"Zoning By-law" means the Township of Lucan Biddulph Comprehensive Zoning By-law currently in effect.

#### 2. PROHIBITIONS

- 2.1 No person shall emit or cause sound resulting from an act listed in Schedule "A" if clearly audible at a point of reception located in an area of the municipality within a prohibited time shown for such an area.
- 2.2 No person shall permit the emission of sound resulting from an act listed in Schedule "A" if clearly audible at a point of reception located in an area of the municipality within a prohibited time shown for such an area

#### 3. EXEMPTION

#### 3.1 Public Safety

Notwithstanding any other provision of this by-law, it shall be lawful to emit or cause or permit the emission of sound or vibration in connection with emergency measures undertaken:

- 3.1.1 for the immediate health, safety or welfare of any person, or
- 3.1.2 for the preservation or restoration of property,

unless such sound or vibration is clearly of a longer duration or nature or more disturbing than is reasonably necessary for the accomplishment of such emergency purpose.

#### 3.2 Agricultural Activity

Notwithstanding any provisions of this by-law, it shall be lawful to emit or cause or permit the emission of sound or vibration in connection with the operation of any equipment related to normal farm practices.

#### 3.3 Educational Institutions

Notwithstanding any other provision of this by-law, it shall be lawful to emit or cause or permit the emission of sound or vibrations in connection with the normal operation of educational institutions during regular business hours and/or during school authorized activities.

#### 3.4 Traditional or Religious Activities

Notwithstanding any other provision of this by-law, this by-law does not apply to a person who emits or causes or permits the emission of sound or vibration in connection with any of the listed traditional, festive, religious or other activities:

ringing of church bells;

 parades approved by the Municipality, the County of Middlesex and/or the Ontario Provincial Police.

#### 3.5 Municipal Activity

Notwithstanding any other provision of this by-law, it shall be lawful to emit or cause or permit the emission of sound or vibrations in connection with the operation of municipal service vehicles and related equipment.

#### 4. GRANT OF EXEMPTION BY CLERK

#### 4.1 Exemption – application process

Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law, any person may make application to the Clerk to request an exemption from any of the provisions of this by-law with respect to any source of sound or vibration for which they might be prosecuted.

#### 4.2 Exemption – details of application

The application mentioned in Section 4.1 shall be made in writing, at least sixty (60) days prior to the proposed date of the event and shall include:

- 4.2.1 The name and address of the applicant;
- 4.2.2 The location of the premises where the proposed exemption is being sought;
- 4.2.3 A description of the type of sound or vibration in respect of which the exemption is sought;
- 4.2.4 Statement of the particular provision or provisions of the by-law from which the exemption is sought;
- 4.2.5 The reasons why the exemption should be granted; and
- 4.2.6 The application for exemption fees as set out in the Municipality's current Fees and Charges By-law.

#### 4.3 Exemption – appeal of decision

If an exemption is denied by the Clerk, the applicant may appeal the decision to Council within ten (10) business days of the written decision provided by municipal staff. The appeal must be made in writing and addressed to the Clerk of the Municipality. Council shall consider the appeal, which will be accompanied by a report from the Clerk at a regularly scheduled meeting of Council.

#### 4.4 Exemption – breach

Breach by the applicant of any of the terms or conditions of the exemption shall render the exemption null and void.

#### 5. SEVERABILITY

If a court of competent jurisdiction should declare any section or part of a section of this by-law to be invalid, such section or part of a section shall not be construed as having persuaded or influenced Council to pass the remainder of the by-law and it is hereby declared that the remainder of the by-law shall be valid and shall remain in force.

#### 6. ENFORCEMENT

- 6.1 Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the *Provincial Offences Act* and as set out in Schedule "B", Set Fines.
- 6.2 The provisions of this By-law shall be enforced by an Officer.

#### 7. EFFECTIVE DATE

This by-law shall come into force and take effect on the day of the final reading thereof.

#### 8. REPEALED BY-LAW

By-law 36-2002 is hereby repealed.
