#### Reminder!! Don't blow it – grass clippings and leaves don't belong on roads.

- Damp grass blown onto a gravel road can clump together and if graded into the gravel, can create potholes.
- Any vegetation blown onto the road can lead to a small amount of organic debris getting into the gravel over time. This can slow drainage from the road.
- Cumulative amounts of vegetation can impact drainage. Catch basins and storm water drains may get blocked, impacting your own lot drainage.
- Damp or wet cuttings blown on to a hard surface road can reduce the traction for vehicles and cyclists, particularly if they had to brake on the cuttings.
