Middlesex County Connect is an inter-community public transit service that provides connections between local municipalities within Middlesex County and links them to the hubs of London, St. Thomas, Woodstock, and Ingersoll.

With an affordable \$5 one-way fare, Middlesex County Connect enables residents to access post-secondary institutions, employment, medical appointments, social programs, grocery stores, and visit friends and family. The service also integrates with other inter-community and local transit systems, including London Transit (LTC), Woodstock Transit, and Railway City Transit (RCT).

Voyago, the service provider, currently operates the following Middlesex County Connect round-trip bus routes:

Route 1: Lucan, Ilderton, Arva, and London (weekdays only) Route 2: Woodstock, Ingersoll, Putnam, Dorchester, and London (weekdays only)


Route 3: Dorchester, London, St. Thomas, and Southwold (Monday to Saturday)

All buses are wheelchair accessible, featuring high-floor ramp access, two dedicated wheelchair spaces, and a wheelchair lift. Each bus is also equipped with a front-mounted bike rack that accommodates up to two bikes. Children aged 5 and under, support persons, and veterans ride free of charge. The service offers flexibility by accepting both cash and credit/debit payments on board. The user-friendly Blaise Transit app enhances the commuting experience by allowing riders to book trips, pre-pay fares, and track bus arrivals via smartphone. Riders without access to a smartphone can book trips online at ride.blaisetransit.com or through the call center at 1-888-465-0783. Those without access to a smartphone or computer can arrive at a Middlesex County Connect bus stop at least 5 minutes before the scheduled pick-up time and pay on board.

Please note that passengers boarding without pre-booking may not be able to secure a seat due to limited availability. Pre-booking is recommended, with trips available for reservation up to 7 days in advance or at least 2 hours before departure for same-day rides.

Students can purchase a discounted 30-day pass for \$160, which provides unlimited rides on all routes for the duration of the pass. Free individual and family bus passes are also available at libraries in Lucan, Ilderton, and Dorchester, making the service even more accessible and affordable.

Middlesex County Connect is funded by the Government of Ontario's Community Transportation Grant Program. Provincial funding for the service will end on March 31, 2025.

Huron Shores Area Transit

Get where you want to go with the Huron Shores Area Transit bus service! This affordable bus system is designed to provide residents with affordable transportation options while connecting our local towns and villages to one another. This Transit system is made possible through an Ontario Community Transportation Grant. This grant supports local and intercommunity bus services in areas currently underserved by public transit. The Grand Bend to and from London Route (Route 2/Green Route) runs seven days a week; this is the route that the Lucan Biddulph community is serviced by. Transit fares vary from \$5.00 - \$20.00 depending on where your destination and arrival locations are. Children aged 4 and under ride for free. The Lucan Biddulph bus stop is located on Main Street in front of the Lucan Biddulph

Community Memorial Centre.

Stops include Sobeys Plaza in Grand Bend, Main Street and Ontario Street North, Dashwood Road at Centre Street in Dashwood, Mill Avenue at Bluewater Municipal Building in Zurich, 108 King Street at the Heritage Hall in Hensall, Main Street Exeter at Victoria Street, Sanders Street and Huron Street West, Huron Park on Airport Line at Stephen Township Arena, Lucan on Main Street at the Community Memorial Centre and London on Fanshawe Road and North Centre Road in front of the RBC or London Transit stop #705.

Beginning in 1995 The Lucan and Area Heritage Society has worked tirelessly to preserve and present the history of Lucan and the surrounding area. This includes the story of the infamous Black Donnelly family. This story has continued to fascinate and continues to inspire works of literature and film. Our museum houses the Ray Fazakas collection of Donnelly family artifacts, as well as an expansive section on the history of Lucan-Biddulph. We also have two historic buildings, a barn used by Hearn's Dairy in the region that dates to the turn of the century, and a log cabin built in the 1860s moved onto the site in the year 2000 which shares a floorplan and construction style similar to the original Donnelly Homestead.



We will be open from May through September and continue to offer services such as the Vigilante Bus Tour, our Donnelly Presentation, and our upcoming Virtual Tours.

Ausable Bayfield Conservation Trails Lucan Conservation Area

Lucan Conservation Area is an eight-acre property adjacent to the Little Ausable River in the McGillivray Ward of North Middlesex. Half of the property is floodplain and the remainder is a rolling upland hardwood forest.

The Little Ausable subwatershed has a high level of stress with respect to water quality. The property, although small, improves subwatershed health.




